

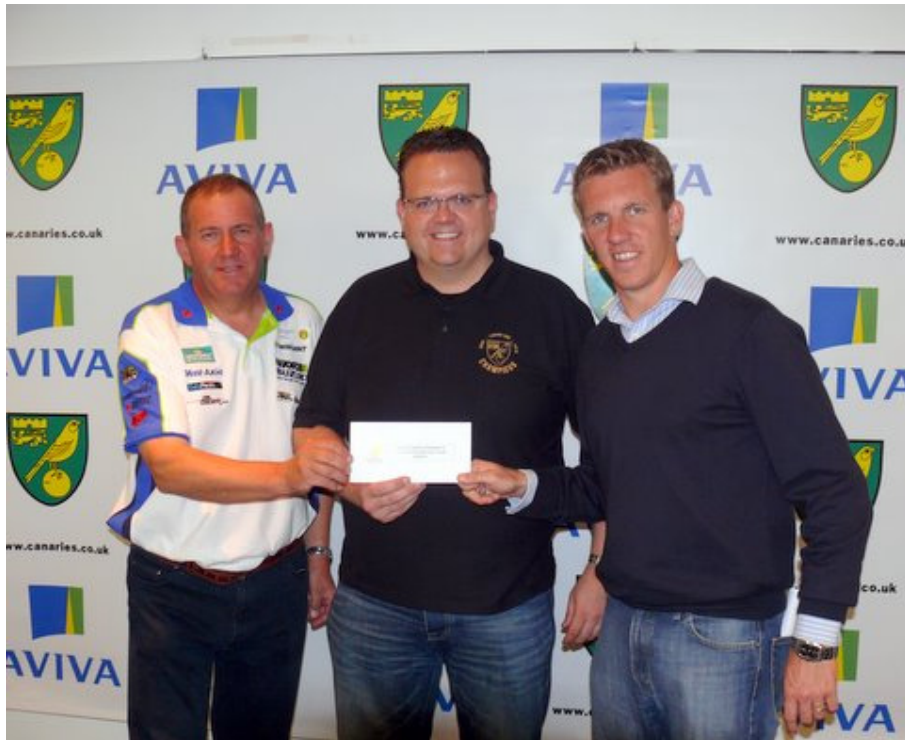

Eendracht Aalst Tournament 13.05.10

We continue to catch up with events from late last season by giving you a brief report of a success for our Under-15s where they secured a tournament win when they returned from Aalst in Belgium as winners of the International Youth Tournament staged by host club Eendracht Aalst.

The trip to the tournament was jointly sponsored by Friends of Norwich City Youth (FONCY) and the Norwich City FC Shareholders Association.

The youngsters paid back the faith of the Canary supporters to win the tournament convincingly.

The squad travelled over by Eurostar and made the short transfer from Brussels to Aalst to their hotel on the outskirts of the host city.

The following morning saw a damp and cold day in Belgium where they played their opening group game against host club Eendracht Aalst.

Group games were played over 25 minutes with the final being played over two 15 minute halves.

As well as picking up the tournament trophy, midfielder Reece Hall-Johnson was awarded the Player of the Tournament trophy.

Following Josh Dawkin's hat-trick at Tottenham, I posed the question in the last programme 'Who was the last City player to score a hat-trick at an away FA Premier League Under 18 match?' The answer is Luke Daley in the match v Leicester City on 8th March 2008. Having stormed to a 5-2 lead with goals also from Corey Smith and trialist Jordan Dowdican, Norwich held on until 10 minutes before time, when Leicester City's Billy McKay not only completed his own hat-trick, he then went on to score a further two goals, which resulted in a 5-5 draw.

From the Archives

Last season saw a mixed bag of results for Norwich Under-18s against their local rivals from Ipswich.

The home game at Colney in November 2009 saw Norwich win comfortably 3-0. The goals for the Canaries came from Tyree Clarke and a brace from Danny Kelly. It was an important victory, coming just a few days after the disappointing Youth Cup defeat at Torquay. The return match at Playford Road was postponed in January and was eventually played as the last game of the season on 1st May this year. Despite taking the lead through a George Francomb penalty, City lost the match 2-1 in a game from which they probably deserved a point.

The Ipswich match is always an interesting one for "From the Archives". There is such a long history of matches between Norwich and Ipswich at this level that it is sometimes difficult to know what to pick.

Today we have gone a long way back and look at the FA Youth Cup tie in 71/72 season. In that season Norwich reached the Youth Cup semi-final where they lost to Liverpool 1-0 on aggregate.

Having beaten Soham Town Rangers 10-0 at Trowse, in the first round, the Canaries faced Ipswich in the second round at Carrow Road, in all three matches were needed to decide the tie. The first match and replay at Portman Road both finished 1-1 with Norwich's goal coming from Fred Easthall in both games. The second replay at Carrow Road finally saw Norwich run out 3-0 winners with the goals coming from Easthall again and Paul Kerlin and Billy Steele.

City's line-up for the 3-0 win was: Roger Hansbury, Paul Wilson, Paul Kent, Paul Fryer, Andy Rollings, Stephen Goodwin, Fred Easthall, Paul Cheesley, Gary Jacobs, Billy Steele, Paul Kerlin. Sub: Trevor Harmer.

Surely five Pauls in a team is a record, let alone confusing for the team! Let us look at three of those players who went on to significant league football careers.

Roger Hansbury was at Carrow Road a long time but always lived in the shadow of Kevin Keelan and then Chris Woods before leaving in 1981. He went on to play for a number of clubs including Burnley, Cambridge, Birmingham and Cardiff and now lives in the West Midlands.

Paul Cheesley also looked to be going on to a promising career after moving to Bristol City before a bad knee injury stopped him in his tracks and forced him to retire from league football. He has settled in the south-west.

Billy Steele was another player from this group forced to retire early from the game after over 50 games for Norwich. He moved to Canada in 2001.
